Worship team leader Chris McPherson recruited a youth worship team representing seven different churches, and students were given worship song programs to facilitate more active participation. And participate they did!

A lighthouse symbol provided the backdrop as Chris began the event by asking, "Is there anyone out there who has found Jesus?" The electrified crowd hollered a resounding, "Yes!"

He then led the crowd in corporate prayer. "We are meeting together because of what *You* did on the cross for all of us. *You* have called us to this city to be lighthouses for *You* – a catalyst to reach our friends, family, classmates and teachers."


Students prayed in clusters for their campuses, specifically asking God to:

- Protect their schools and friends from the evil one.
- Give them a passion for Him.
- Pour out His Holy Spirit on their city, their schools and their lives.

Then, guest speaker Derron Higgins addresses the crowd. "Wow! This is what the body of Christ looks like in Modesto!" He challenged the students that there is no greater mission field than their campus. As an invitation was given, students came forward and prayed with their friends to receive Christ.

Students were given the opportunity to pray alone in order to get their lives right with God. Several came down by them-

Melissa had the opportunity to pray with Brady, a girl she had just met, who turned and asked her, "Will you go down to pray with me?" Brady ended up committing her life to Christ.
